### From The Pastor:

#### Included in the Faith

<sup>40</sup> One of the two men who followed Jesus after they heard John speak about him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.<sup>41</sup> The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and say to him, "We have found the Messiah." ("Messiah" means "Christ.")<sup>42</sup> Then Andrew took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas." ("Cephas" means "Peter.")<sup>43</sup> The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me."<sup>44</sup> Philip was from the town of Bethsaida, where Andrew and Peter lived.<sup>45</sup> Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the man that Moses wrote about in the law, and the prophets also wrote about him. He is Jesus, the son of Joseph, from Nazareth."<sup>46</sup> But Nathanael said to Philip, "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" Philip answered, "Come and see." John 1 40-46

Some of us have always been in this congregation. Many others of us have made decisions to be part of this congregation. Coming to a body of believers is often the beginning of a process of becoming part of the people of God. We as people in the church are the ones who should demonstrate the principles of the kingdom to others who are searching for the purpose in life that only God can give. Many of the things we do are reflections of God's grace. We pray for and encourage people in our congregation and support our brothers and sisters in their times of difficulty. We also pray for those whom we do not know. Every positive action of our life together can be a demonstration of the love of Christ. No matter how well we demonstrate the love of God in our congregation, it is useless unless others see it. I believe it is important that we not only live as Christians but that we make a conscious effort to make it easy for people to see Christ in us.

When Andrew told Simon he had found the messiah in Jesus, he didn't explain doctrine or argue the reasons he believed Jesus was the Christ, he simply took him to Jesus. When Phillip found Nathaniel and told him he had found the Christ he simply said "come and see".

One of the most effective ways to show Christ to people is to invite people to "Come and See" what happens here. 75% of the people who come to a church, attend because a friend invited them. We sometimes depend on people to come on their own and that happens, but, most people feel more comfortable to have a "guide" to bring them in and introduce them and include them in all that happens here. During the fall months, there are several events that are opportunities to invite our friends to come and see... the fall breakfast, the fall festival, thanksgiving and Christmas. What a great time to let others see the joy of being in a Christian fellowship. You have the opportunity to be a guide to the first step of allowing people to know a loving savior who has a wonderful plan for their life. Ask someone you know to Come and See.

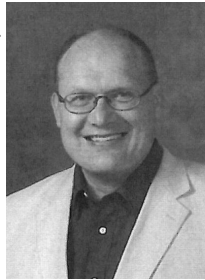

By all accounts the very first ever Moravian Festival September 10 at **New Philadelphia** was a huge hit. More than 4,000 tickets were sold beforehand, and educated estimates say many more than that attended. Not since we filled Winston-Salem's old Memorial Coliseum for the Quincentennial in 1957 — you youngsters ask your grandparents — have we had so many Moravians gathered in one spot. Food booths and artists and crafts and church outreach and 5K race and history and traditions and music were all in abundance — except we hear tell the cook ran out of food. (Can you believe that at a Moravian event?) All in all, from the mayor on down, everyone had a grand time at the Moravian Festival. Tremendous thanks to one and all who worked and contributed and sat and played to make this day possible. Now let's get going and spread the joy.

**Friedberg** is offering a new monthly worship opportunity called "The Fellowship." It is meeting at 7 p.m. the second Sunday of the month at least through the end of the year, and is offering a relaxed atmosphere, food and fellowship, live contemporary worship, praise and prayer, personal testimonies, and open discussion about Bible truths. **Covenant** as drilled a new well at only 60 feet instead of the expected 170, which will save a pretty penny in the church budget.
