### FROM OUR PASTOR:

#### Why Worry?

I was flipping through the television channels the other day and ran across a preacher selling dehydrated meals in five gallon buckets for people to prepare for the disasters that will be coming in the last times. For a \$1,000.00 donation, he will send you 270 of these little packets. I'm sure he makes a great living playing upon people's fears. I see people who spend all of their time wringing their hands and worrying. They think of all the things that could happen and are constantly stomping out imaginary brush fires. Matthew 6 tells us not to worry about these things.

*<sup>25</sup>"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? <sup>26</sup>Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? <sup>27</sup>Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?" Matthew 6:25-26 NIV*

When we worry, we deny the power of God. We are demonstrating unbelief. We proclaim on one hand that Jesus saves us from sin, but do not believe the power of God can get us through the days ahead. It is precisely when we are not self-sufficient that we see God's hand in the most powerful way. This is why giving to others is such an important part of the Christian life. 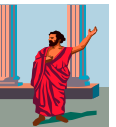

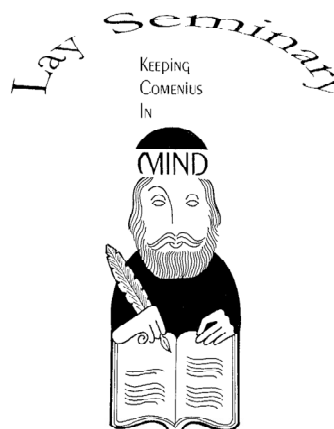
