From Our Pastor:

.HOW MANY DOORS DO WE HAVE AT OUR CHURCH?

It took me a while to mentally count the doors, but I counted 13 outside doors to our church building. Some of them are used daily and some are seldom used. After you get into the building, how many doors are there? I had to walk through the building to make this count and I found 101 doors (counting any door a person could walk through with double doors counting as only one). This includes the 13 outside. Each door gives physical access to a building, room or closet which would be unavailable if it were not there. Cabinet doors do not count.

HOW MANY SPIRITUAL DOORS DO WE HAVE AT OUR CHURCH?

The point of the church is to have as many ways as possible for people to come to know Christ. Ideally there would be over 300 doors at Rural Hall because there are over 300 people here and we should always be doors for people to come into a relationship with God through Jesus. There are other doors as well...they are the groups and ministries within the church. These doors are the worship service, Sunday school classes, women's fellowship, men's fellowship, logos, youth fellowship and other groups.

The question is, are our lives and activities open doors which point to Christ? This is what we are called to be.

Each unit has one bedroom with a walk-in-closet, a living room with a coat closet, bathroom, kitchen and its own porch. The entire unit is around 700 square feet with one entrance. There is wall to wall carpet in the living room and bedroom with vinyl in the bathroom and kitchen. The apartments also come with garbage disposals, frost free refrigerator, apartment size stoves and mini blinds.

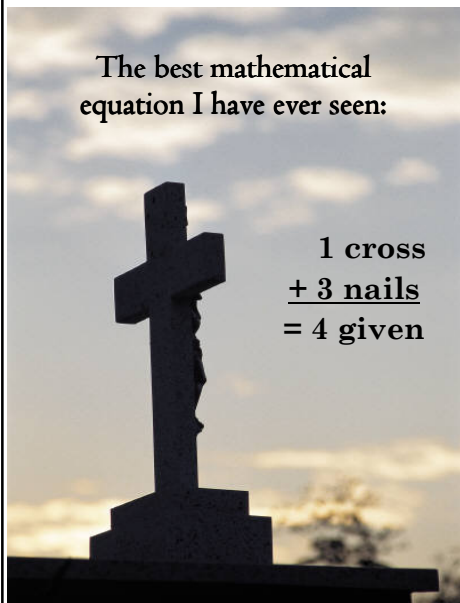
